## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 12, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2024 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

## Results of Operations

### Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned 5.4% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 9.0% for the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI World (Net) Index, and a return of 8.7% for the Fund's narrow index, the Dow Jones Islamic Market World Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equity markets generally rose over the period as most central banks began to cut interest rates. Share prices increased in relation to corporate earnings, with gains in U.S. markets driven mainly by a small number of mega-capitalization stocks. The global economy was resilient as inflation continued to slow across most major markets, although unemployment moved slightly higher.

Within the Dow Jones Islamic Market World Index, Lithuania, Belgium and China were the best-performing markets in Canadian dollar terms, while South Korea, Chile and the Netherlands were the weakest. The utilities, communication services and information technology sectors were the strongest performers, while energy, financials and health care were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed both the broad-based index and the narrow index, with stock selection in the United States detracting from performance. In sector terms, stock selection in information technology and consumer staples detracted from performance. Conversely, stock selection in the health care sector contributed to performance relative to both indices. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison.

Relative to the narrow index, stock selection in China also detracted from performance. Conversely, stock selection in Japan and Australia contributed to performance relative to the narrow index.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the Fund.

## Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Impact

The Fund invests only in stocks included in the Dow Jones Islamic Market World Index. These companies have been screened for Shariah compliance, meaning they do not derive more than 5% of their revenue from non-compliant activities. Non-compliant sources of revenue include alcohol, tobacco and electronic cigarettes, recreational cannabis products, pork-related products, conventional financial services (including banking, insurance, investment services, insurance brokers and mortgage finance), weapons and defence, and entertainment (including hotels, casinos/gambling, cinema, pornography and music). Mackenzie has appointed Ratings Intelligence Partners LLP as the Shariah advisor to advise the Fund with regard to its interpretation of and compliance with Shariah principles. The semi-annual audit conducted by Ratings Intelligence found the Fund to be compliant with Shariah principles.

## Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 90.8% during the period to \$18.0 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.8 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$7.8 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

At September 30, 2024, 15.0% of the Fund's NAV was held by investors that individually owned 10% or more of the Fund. As a result, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At September 30, 2024, Mackenzie had received no such notices.

## Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2024, was generally similar to the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2024. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for Series AR, Series PW and Series PWR increased, due to the Manager decreasing waivers on management and/or administration fees. The Manager may discontinue the practice of absorbing management and/or administration fees at any time without prior notice to investors. The MERs for Series D and Series PWFB increased, due to changes in their average net assets. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

## Recent Developments

The Fund rebalances and trades daily based on the portfolio management team's assessment of the return potential of individual stocks, including the impact of transaction costs. The team's quantitative, bottom-up stock selection process aims to add portfolio value in a variety of market conditions through investments in both growth- and value-oriented stocks and in small-, mid- and large-capitalization stocks. As such, the team does not routinely generate market expectations and therefore rarely makes investment decisions according to macroeconomic forecasts.

The following changes to the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee occurred:

- effective September 13, 2023, Saijal Patel was appointed;
- effective March 5, 2024, Atul Tiwari resigned; and
- effective April 30, 2024, the terms for Robert Hines and George Hucal expired, and Rebecca Cowdry was appointed.

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## Related Party Transactions

### Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

### Other Related Party Transactions

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie and its affiliates may invest in the Fund. All these investments are made on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At September 30, 2024, funds managed by Mackenzie owned less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day. As a result of these investments, the Fund may be subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions.

At September 30, 2024, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.01 million in the Fund (0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

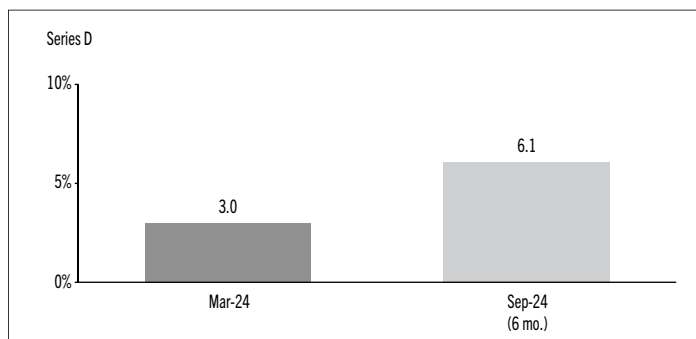
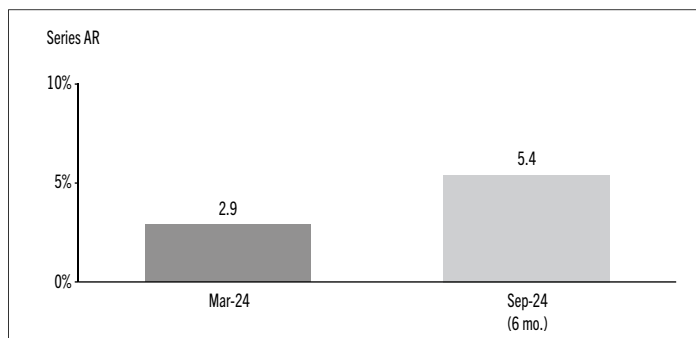
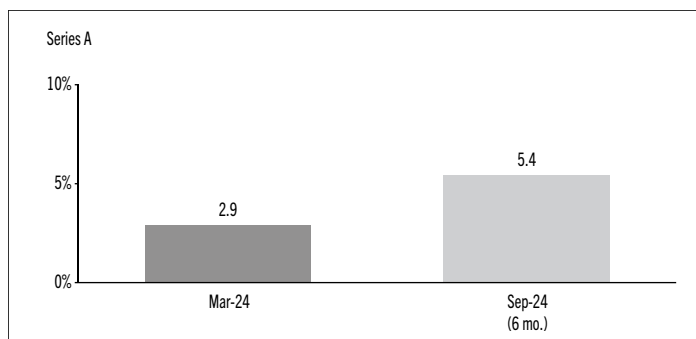
## Past Performance

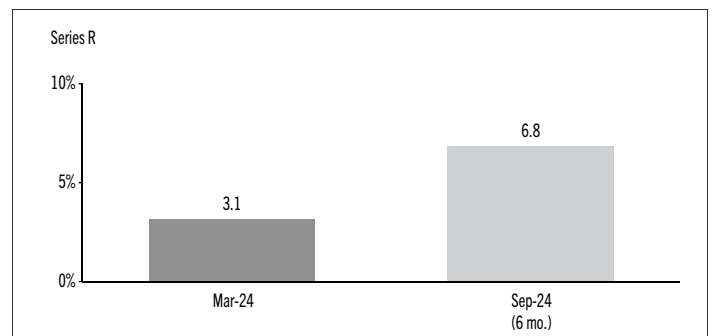
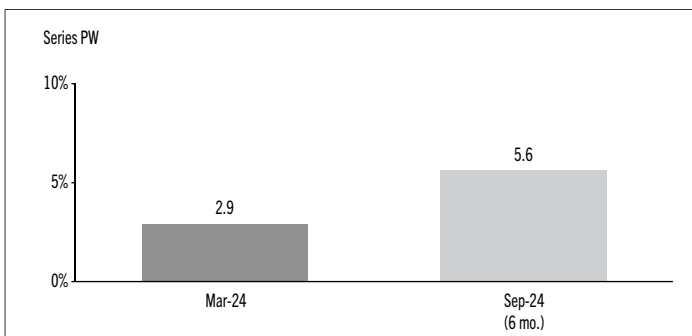
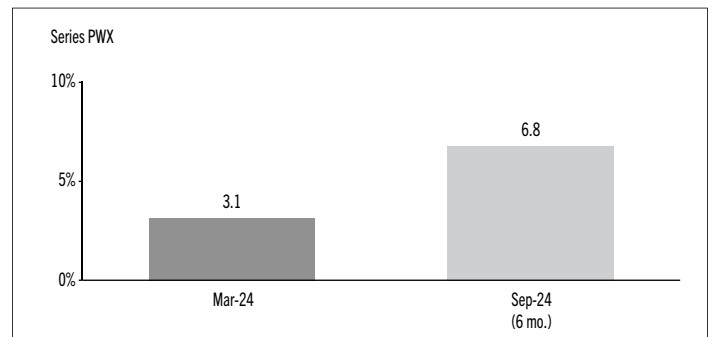
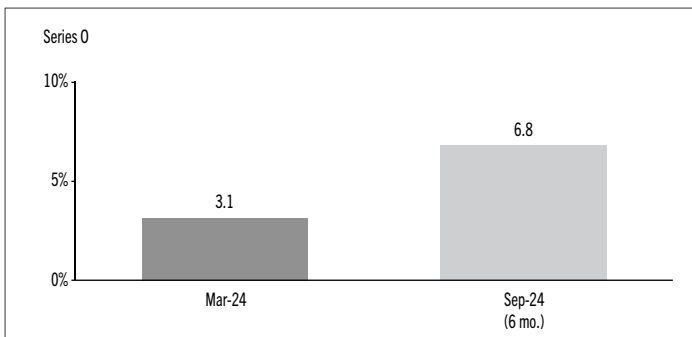
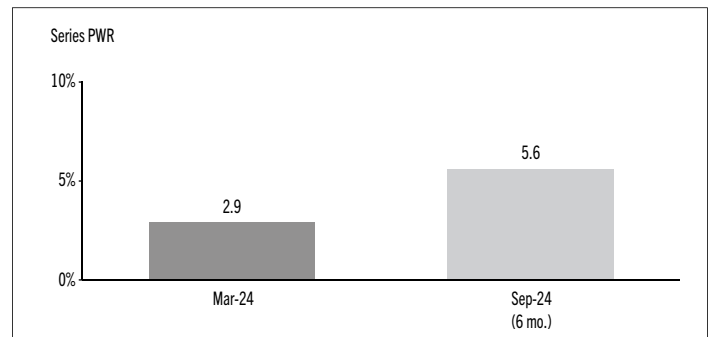
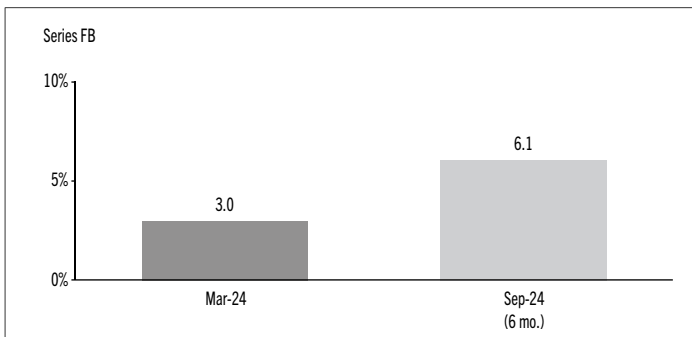
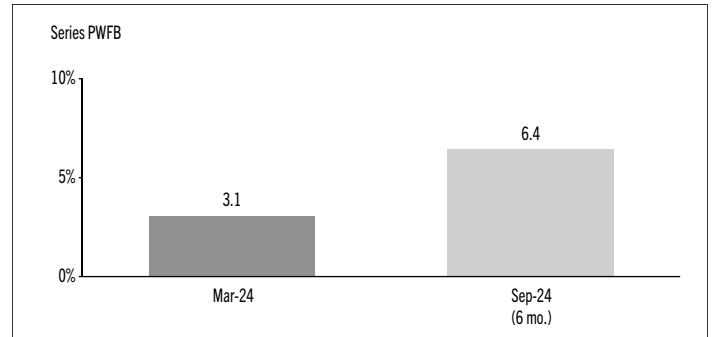
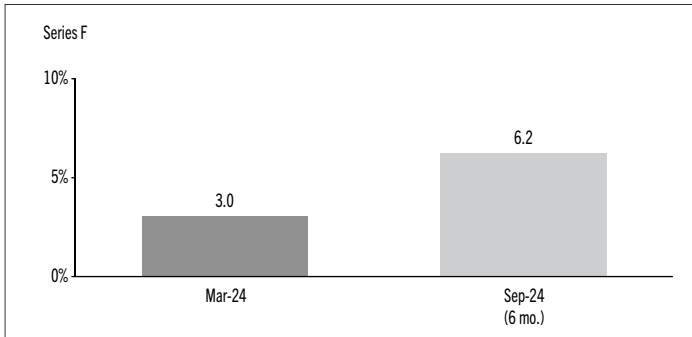
## Year-by-Year Returns

Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or "ETFs"), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.

(3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. The Manager may reimburse the Fund for certain brokerage commissions and other transaction costs (including those payable to the custodian or its agents). The Manager may make these reimbursements at its discretion and stop these reimbursements at any time without notice.

## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: Investors Group Securities Inc. and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 26% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.
